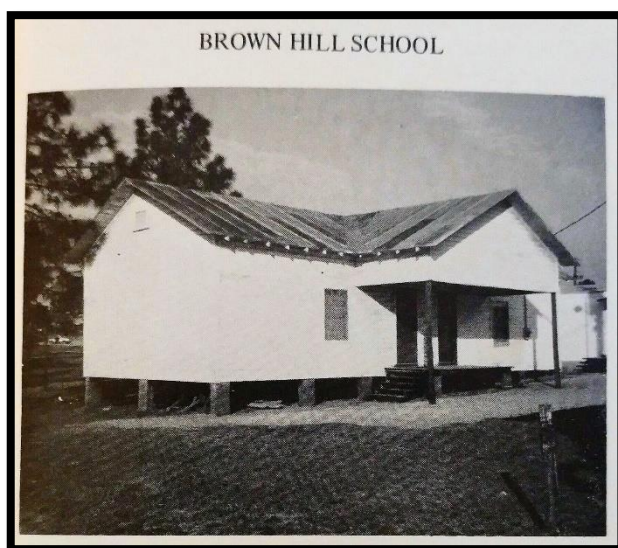


Organization Description and History

Brown Hill Baptist Church is located in Bleckley County and services members from local and surrounding farming areas. Brown Hill has been a community meeting place for over 221 years. All churches in the area branched out from Brown Hill. The location is central to rural living, offers spiritual adult assistance and youth assistance. The congregation consists of approximately 60 members, a wonderful mixture of persons aged 4 to 94 years. In addition to rich history of the church, we also had a local school; which was abolished in 1969 when the school system was integrated. The Brown Hill School building is currently located at the Middle School in Bleckley County and the Brown Hill Church remains committed to serving area youth by offering requested tutoring services. The auxiliaries in the church are the Deacons, Usher, Choir, and Youth choir. Each of these auxiliaries participate in providing training and visiting the sick and shut-in, and nursing homes. We have our own cemetery that dates back to burials in the late 1800's.
